Does your child have a physical or mental impairment that affects their educational experience or performance in school?

If so, they may qualify for educational accommodations through Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. In order to be eligible for services under Section 504, a student must have a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities. A "major life activity" includes, but is not limited to, functions such as:

- Caring for oneself
- Performing manual tasks
- Walking
- Seeing
- Hearing
- Sleeping
- Standing
- Lifting
- Bending
- Reading
- Speaking
- Breathing
- Learning
- Working
- Eating
- Concentrating
- Thinking
- Communicating
- Operating major bodily functions
(including but not limited to functions of the immune system, normal cell growth, digestive, bowel, bladder, neurological, brain, respiratory, circulatory, endocrine, and reproductive functions)

Students currently in Special Education do not qualify for Section 504 accommodations because they already have accommodations in their IEP.
